Number of women who die of heart disease, compared to those who die of breast cancer

Approximate number of women who die of heart disease every year worldwide, accounting for one third of all deaths in women

Percentage of women who have suffered one heart attack that are at risk for a second attack within six years

Percentage of women who experience early warning signs of heart attack that are milder and do not fit male symptoms

Percentage of women who die within one year of having a heart attack, compared to 24% of men

The age under which women's heart attacks are twice as likely as men's to be fatal

Percentage of women who die from heart attacks that have no history of chest pain

Women in this age range are up to 4 times more likely to die from heart bypass surgery than men of the same age
